#### **Professional Learning Culture**

This term we are focusing on our AIP goal of Building a Professional Learning Culture with a content lens of setting up a safe and engaging learning environment. We began learning about the ways in which student behaviour communicates the needs of the child. We are exploring how we teach and reinforce positive behaviours and how we can do this consistently across the school. Our learning will centre around a core belief that everyone has a right to feel safe and a right to learn.

#### Middle Level Leaders

We have announced our Professional Learning Team (Year Level) leaders after an internal, merit-based application process. We work collaboratively one morning a week to develop our leadership skills and capacity to use student data to evaluate our impact on student learning. Currently we are reflecting on our own leadership stance and the way our behaviours and actions position our adult learners in different roles. Sally meets with PLT leaders one hour a week in small groups to support the effective leading of collaborative planning and analysis of student data. #### Staff Wellbeing

Some indicators from the 2019 staff survey showed that staff wellbeing was not as strong as it should be. I have been meeting with each staff member for a 30-60 minute chat to find out a little about their professional history, their time at FPS, and their future aspirations. I have received much positive feedback from the staff that they are feeling happy and energised with a positive outlook for our work ahead. This is also evidenced every day in their enthusiasm, attitudes and commitment to our work and community.

#### **Bilingual Update**

I had the opportunity this week to attend my first network meeting with the leaders of other government bilingual schools across the state. I was welcomed warmly and each Principal in attendance was more than happy to create a time for me to visit over the coming weeks. Members of the bilingual subcommittee are welcome at these visits also. The Bilingual subcommittee have had our first meeting of 2020 and have moved into a phase of research that will lead up to a community information night about bilingual education. I am aware of the history here, the various modes of consultation, and the strong emotional investment in our bilingual program. I want to assure you that I come to this with an open mind, transparency, a fresh view and a genuine interest to develop a pathway forward that meets the needs of our school community and creates genuine pathways for our children in their learning and their futures beyond our gates. We will keep you informed every step of the way.

#### **DRUMMING NEWS 24/2/2020**

#### **Drumming Performance**

Congratulations to the children who performed on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> Feb at Footscray City Primary for an information night on the new Footscray Learning Precinct.

This group was put together following a last minute request from the organisers of the event on the Friday night and required a big effort from Jenny and the parents over the weekend to make sure enough children were available to play. So a big thank you to all involved.

The kids as usual performed at a high standard, were well received by the audience and added a spark to the occasion.

This was the first time that FPS drummers have performed outside the school for a community event and I hope this will be the start of more community engagement with the programs we run.

This same group then also performed at the assembly on the Friday.

#### **Classroom Drumming**

We have now completed three weeks of the drumming program. Jose, who runs the program on Thursdays, has been working with mainly the younger children from Preps to Grade twos as well as a couple of Grade 3/4 classes. He has been introducing the Preps to some basic drumming and rhythm concepts and playing drumming and rhythm games which help develop coordination and listening skills while having fun at the same time. The older children are revising material they have already learnt and adding new material to their repertoire. In my program on Fridays, I have started working on new pieces with the Grade 6 classes using sticks and a "call and response type" rhythm. These rhythms are quite complex and the children will be challenged to listen carefully, concentrate and then play together when responding to the calls. They are progressing quicker than I thought they would. Great work kids!

The Grade 5 classes are working on adding solo parts and variations to the rhythms they already know while the Grade 3/4 classes are revising rhythms and refining their technique to get better sounds from the drums.

#### **Extension Drumming Group**

I will also be starting up an extension drumming group on Fridays at lunchtime and I'm pleased to report that I have had a great response from the children who want to join. At this stage it will be mainly Grade 5 and Grade 6 children participating with a few keen Grade 4 children.

It is a bit of a commitment giving up 30 mins of lunchtime play to participate in this group so I am very happy that there were so many who put their hands up to join.

The children will have their lunch before starting a thirty minute session and then have some time to play outside if they want to before classes resume.

The existing Footscray Library is a highly valued and well-utilised facility, however it falls well short of the design, layout and digital capability of contemporary community facilities.

A Feasibility Study and Business Case have been completed resulting in four concept options for consideration: a like-for-like replacement and small/medium/large options to be developed on the current Footscray library & car park sites.
